About Us

German International School Boston (GISB) is a German school in the heart of Boston. We are an independent, non-profit, international school founded in 2001. The school offers a bilingual education to students from preschool through Grade 12. Of a total enrollment of 259 students, 40 students are in our high school. 40 nationalities are represented, and 24 languages are spoken by our diverse student body. All of our graduates are fluent in English and German and speak a third or fourth language. 84% of our faculty members come from Germany, and nearly 100% of our high school faculty hold advanced degrees. 100% of GISB graduates pursue higher education.

Academic Program

GISB follows a world-renowned curriculum approved by the Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs (KMK) in Germany. Our rigorous bilingual curriculum prepares students for the German International Abitur (Deutsche Internationale Abitur or DIA). Science and mathematics are emphasized with 13–16 hours of instruction per week all four years. College-level mathematics, science, and history are required throughout high school. While not a standalone course, U.S. history topics are incorporated into the four-year history curriculum. All students take German and English Language & Literature, and at least one more world language is required from grade 6 through grade 10. A two-year program in grades 11 and 12 with 11 qualification and examination subjects culminates in final Abitur exams comprised of three written and two oral subject exams proctored by German educational officials. Accreditation

GISB is one of five German schools in the United States that meet the strict accreditation requirements of the German government. We are accredited by the Federal Republic of Germany, a member of the Association of Independent Schools of New England (AISNE), and a registered high school with the Massachusetts Department of Education.

Testing

All curriculum testing assesses three levels of thinking established by the State Ministries of Education of Germany:

1. Understanding of content and the ability to reproduce a text or mathematical problem
2. Analysis, exploration, and interpretation of materials
3. Ability to go beyond the text or mathematical problem to demonstrate or transfer knowledge to another context

Academic Assessment Reporting

GISB's calendar is divided into two semesters beginning in August with a total of 180 school days. GISB does not rank its students and does not weigh grades. The distribution of grades is not published due to the small number of students. Courses are not leveled. Our transcripts denote certain courses as Advanced based on the number of teaching hours. The College Board has authorized the use of the AP designation for our four-year German curriculum. Students may take the AP German Language and Culture exam as early as 10th grade if they feel comfortable doing so. We place the AP label on the 12th grade German course for consistency across students' transcripts.

Students take either Spanish or French beginning in grade 6 and must continue with the same language for five years. Starting in grade 11, students choose four or five of the following subjects: French, Spanish, Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science.

*If the student started the language in 9th grade, they have four hours of instruction per week.

Sports: Ski/Snowboarding (Ski Week), Volleyball, Futsal, and Soccer

Clubs: Creative Writing, Yearbook, Student Newspaper, Environmental Club, GSA, Model UN, Programming & Robotics Club, and Peer Tutoring

Music & Arts: Private Flute, Piano, Violin, Viola, Cello, Trumpet, Saxophone, Guitar, and Voice lessons; GISB Symphony Orchestra and Musical Theater Club
